House By the Side of the Road, located on State St in Ann Arbor, is a 50-year-old non-profit agency run completely by volunteers. Clients pay no money for the items they can select 4 times a year. Donations are accepted at their back door from 9 AM until 1:30PM. They primarily offer clothing, bedding, and household essentials often to people who have experienced family break up, job loss, fire, or prolonged illness.

In addition to our towel donations, Trish Farrell and her rummage sale crew invited a "House" volunteer to select useful items at the end of the church sale. Thank you for that outreach!
