Weekly Events (7th–12th grade).....

THE UNDERGROUND SUMMER – The Underground will continue on in the summer with some slight changes. We will be moving from Sunday nights to Wednesday nights [starting Wednesday, June 20](#). We will still have snacks available, but there will be no meals served in the summer months. The time will also shift to 6:00–8:00 pm every Wednesday night.

ULTIMATE FRISBEE – This year Ultimate Frisbee at Mill Pond Park will be offered on [Thursday evenings from 7:00–8:30 pm](#). We always enjoy some ice cream/popsicles after we play. This is a great event to invite your friends to and we also encourage parents to come and play as well!

BOOK STUDY BREAKFAST – Every [Saturday morning](#) we will be hosting a book study at the Leadley’s house [from 10:00–11:00 am](#). A hot breakfast will be served first before we dive into the book that we will be reading as a group throughout the summer. This summer we will be reading through Shane Claiborne’s “Irresistible Revolution.”

Trips and Overnight Events.....

MOVE – Our high school students will be embarking on a 6-day, 5-night youth conference in Holland, MI from June 25–30 to learn what it means to be a “kingdom worker.” This trip will help springboard us into our local summer missions project, that will be determined by the students. Registration is closed for this event.

MIX – MIX is a 5-day, 4-night event for our current 5th, 6th, and 7th grade students in Holland, MI from July 29–August 2. This trip is designed to speak directly to middle school students about what it means to make their faith real in their lives. It also serves as an intentional transition for students who are looking forward to going to MOVE in their high school years. Registration is online and ends May 27.

CEDAR POINT LOCK-OUT – On July 10 at 7:00 am we will be departing to go spend the day at Cedar Point Amusement Park in Sandusky, OH.
